upon by department 501 of the above-entitled court, the Honorable Charles F. Haines, presiding, on July 7, 2020, and neither party contested the court's tentative ruling. The court therefore having considered the motion, and the opposition thereto, and good cause appearing therefor;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

discretion by dismissing the action with prejudice. The record shows that Petitioner took reasonable steps to inform the Rent Board of his condition before the hearing by leaving a voicemail. This information was in the Rent Board's possession at the time of the dismissal, and became known to the Administrative Law Judge 5 minutes after oral dismissal and two weeks before the written order.
